This year, the show will have lots of exciting features, such as live music and fine food, but one of the more special is our guest speaker, Thomas Jiamachello. Jiamachello is a renowned expert on the Consolidated Glass and Phoenix Glass companies.

He will be speaking about these companies, highlighting some rare and exquisite pieces found in the Houston collection. In addition, he will discuss the history and the craftsmanship behind Victorian era art glass.

The first presentation will be "Phoenix's Celebrated Webb Art Glass 1883-1887" on Saturday at 1:00pm, and the second will be "Consolidated Glass: Masters of Cased Glass in America" on Sunday at 1:00pm.

Jiamachello is also offering verbal appraisals on glass items. Guests may bring up to 3 glass pieces for a fee of \$5 per item, to be examined and identified. Times for the appraisals are Friday the $23^{\rm rd}$, 10am-1pm and Saturday the $24^{\rm th}$, 2-4pm.
